10 minutes  Daily Reading	Jack and the beanstalk https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=oyYh43hxSts Share the story with your little one and talk about Jacks beanstalk, is it taller than your home? Does it reach the top? Who else might live at the top with the giant?
5 mins  Brain Break	How about a game? All you need is a little music...Similar to musical statues but instead of standing still when the music stops, how about pretending to be a bean? 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	 <p>Magic Beans</p> <p>You will need - Whole class; large space.</p> <p>Actions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Broad beans: Stand with legs apart and arms out to the side. Stick beans: Stand tall with arms at sides. Baked beans: Sit down with feet off the ground. Runner beans: Run around. Jumping beans: Jump. Frozen beans: Freeze (stay still). Chilli beans: Shiver. Jelly beans: Wobble. Magic beans: Run around (avoid getting caught). <p>What you do</p> <p>After a warm-up session, introduce the game "Magic beans" and explain/demonstrate the different actions. When you shout "Magic beans" you have to catch two children and they become your helpers. The game continues until there's one boy and girl left.</p>
10 minutes  Daily Writing	Can you draw a BIG beanstalk? How many leaves might you add? What colour will your beanstalk be? 
5 mins	<p>Time for some stretching!</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Can you crouch down small like a tiny bean? 2. Can you reach up tall and touch the sky?


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 Brain Break	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 3. Can you reach your arms out wide like the giant beanstalk leaves? 4. Can you pretend to climb the beanstalk, one leg at a time? 5. Now you are at the top of your beanstalk, can you look all around at the amazing things hiding right at the top 6. Can you put your arms out to the side and hold your balance to make sure you don't fall? 7. Quick the giant has seen you can you run away quickly 8. Find somewhere to hide so the giant can't find you 9. Find something special to take back down the beanstalk 10. Time to climb back down until you are safely on the ground
10 minutes  Daily Maths	<p>Can you draw ten big beanstalk leaves and with the help of your grown up label them one to ten? Now find some small objects maybe peas, beans or buttons and add the right amount to each leaf using your amazing counting. Make sure you take a picture for us to see what you've been doing?</p>
