

The princess of the kingdom discovers the villain's hideout and tells her old friend who is a speaking goldfish. Together, they set out to expose the evil sorcerer and rescue the unicorns. 


Aladdin had 3 palaces, each one had 13 cleaners, 2 cooks and 5 waiters.

Step one
