

Maths: This term we will be working on addition and subtraction within 50. Then we will be moving onto fractions, finding a half and quarter of different shapes and amounts. Later in the term we will be exploring measures, learning to measure length, height and weight in different ways.

It would be really helpful if children could practise their number bonds at home.



English: We are starting this term with some non-fiction writing, where we will write a recount of our educational visit to Bath. Then we will be learning our new story 'Monkey See Monkey Do'. We will be writing longer sentences to create our own stories and using adjectives to add detail.



To help at home please tell the story to each other and practise the spellings the children are learning.

Topic: What shall I wear?

This term we will be continuing to explore the question 'What shall I wear?' We will be focussing more on the history of clothes this term. Beginning with an exciting visit to Bath Fashion Museum, where we will learn lots of interesting facts about how clothes have changed through time.
